



## June 2016 Newsletter

Summer is here and it is time for another POST newsletter. This will have several resources that I hope you will take advantage of as you plan for the future training of your agencies.

The International Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training (IADLEST) is currently creating a 40-hour training course for academy directors. IADLEST recognized there is currently no training in this area and is working to fill this void. I will notify all academy directors once I hear the training course has been created and is available. Speaking of IADLEST, they have several web-related resources that you may find beneficial to your agency.

- The first is NLEARN. This is a free resource for police and sheriff's academy directors, managers, coordinators and trainers. It is as simple as typing in [www.iadlest.org/Projects/NLEARN.aspx](http://www.iadlest.org/Projects/NLEARN.aspx). Once there, click on the large green arrow in the right side of the screen for NLEARN Users. There are podcasts from Community Oriented Policing Services and the Bureau of Justice Assistance, along with several pages of libraries of courses of all types.
- NCP, National Certification Program, is an on line resource providing both in-person and classroom courses that have been vetted and certified by IADLEST. The website is <http://www.iadlest.org/Home.aspx>. Once there, look on the left side of the Home Page under "Featured Projects" and click on "National Certification Catalog." You can select filters on the left side of the page to limit or expand the specific type of training you are seeking. Vendors that make it onto this website have been vetted by the IADLEST training staff and received the national certification seal. This seal is good for two years and all training courses must be resubmitted and reevaluated every two years. As of today, there are 94 LE courses, 36 fire service courses and 38 EMS courses. This list should continue to grow as vendors learn of this resource and seek to be published here.
- The NDI, National Decertification Index, is another IADLEST resource. It serves as a national registry of certificate or license revocation actions relating to officer misconduct. This information is voluntarily supplied by those states that choose to participate. This index currently contains 20,922 actions reported by 40 states. **All reported actions should be verified with the contributing authority.** The website address is <http://www.iadlest.org/Home.aspx> and then click on "National Decertification Index" on the left-hand side of the Home Page. There is a sign-on page that verifies you are in law enforcement and should have access to the listed information.

Lastly, there are several critical dates that occur throughout the year because of statutory, fiscal or POST rule requirements. I want to provide a list of important POST dates to all of you to help limit confusion and assist with communication. Three separate lists are attached for your reference, Important Agency Dates, Important Dates for Academy Directors and POST Board Members, and Important Dates for Training Regions. As always, I welcome your feedback.

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## Important Dates for Agencies

<b>January</b>	Compliance report disseminated to all agencies (Rule 28)
	Agencies have 30-day window to dispute the compliance report, and provide additional training records

<b>February</b>	Final compliance report sent to agencies (Rule 28)
	Agencies have 30 days to dispute the report using Rule 5-Hearings Procedures
	A training evaluation is sent to all agencies for input

<b>March</b>	<b>March 1-31st</b> Application period for <b>individual</b> agencies to submit their in-service continuing education grant applications to POST for the next fiscal year
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<b>May</b>	<b>May 30th</b> - Applications are approved, denied or modified by POST Director
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<b>June</b>	2016-HB-1254 Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD) curriculum must be available online by 6/30/16
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<b>July</b>	2015-HB-1287 <b>7/1/17</b> - All certified officers must have completed each of the following <b>2 hour</b> classes: <b>Anti-Bias, Proper Holds and Restraints, Community Policing/Community Partnership, and Situational De-escalation</b> <b>7/1/17-</b> Agencies begin a 2 year cycle of the above 4 classes and must be completed every 5 years
	*Agencies that are out of compliance with Rule 28 from the prior year will have all POST funds suspended from 7/1-12/31 of the same year

<b>December</b>	<b>12/31</b> - Last day to submit waivers to POST Director (Rule 28)

<b>January</b>	<b>January 31-</b> Second quarterly regional grantee reports due to POST
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<b>March</b>	<b>March 1-31st</b> Application period for <b>Training Regions</b> to submit their regional grant applications to POST for the next fiscal year
	<b>March 31st</b> - every 3 years a needs assessment must be completed and submitted to POST with application. Next needs assessment is due <b>March 2017</b> .
	<b>March 31st</b> - Notification from regional grantees to POST on any potential unspent funds for current fiscal year

<b>April</b>	POST Board Grant Sub-Committee meets to review and recommend funding for each Training Region
	<b>April 30-</b> Third quarterly regional grantee reports due to POST

<b>June</b>	POST Board approves final awards at the June POST Board meeting for the following fiscal year
	<b>June 30th</b> - all monies from current fiscal year must be reported/requested, and all items purchased must have been delivered and received by this date
	<b>June 30th-</b> annual equipment report is submitted to POST by training regions

<b>July</b>	<b>July 31st</b> - Final regional grantee reports due to POST
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<b>October</b>	<b>October 31-</b> First quarterly regional grantee reports due to POST

<b>March</b>	POST Board Meeting, 1st Friday (subject to change)

<b>June</b>	POST Board Meeting, 1st Friday (subject to change)
<b>July</b>	<b>July 1st</b> -Sunrise review must be submitted to POST board for review of groups wishing to seek police officer status (Rule 22)
<b>September</b>	POST Board Meeting, 2nd Friday (subject to change)
	POST Board Member work session on Thursday prior to September POST Board Meeting.
<b>October</b>	Academy Directors meeting with POST
<b>December</b>	POST Board Meeting, 1st Friday (subject to change)
